However, he discovered that he could use his tongue to decipher the Moon Type system of dashes.

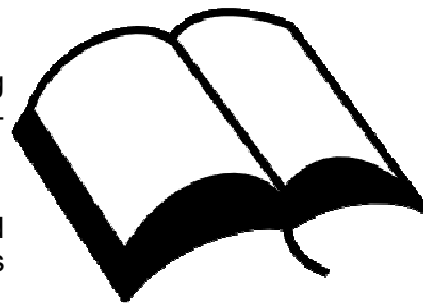
The metal left his lips and tongue bleeding and sore, but he continued to learn the alphabet.

"God loves you and I love you and that's the way it's gonna be!" —Mike



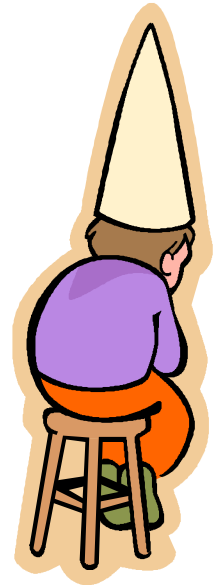

Teaching Tips: "Don'ts About Bible Teaching"

1. Don't ever embarrass a child.
2. Don't ever talk harshly to a child.
3. Don't depend upon the manual for your teaching.
4. Don't add to your stories where the Bible has not added.
5. Don't be afraid of their questions. (Handle them.)
6. Don't give a child busy work.
7. Don't have "round robin" reading in Bible class.
8. Don't ask children to do what you aren't willing to do. (Memory work, role-playing, tests, etc.)
9. Don't allow children to make fun of other children or class activities.
10. Don't use the same teaching method all the time.
