He is married to the former Courtney Paugh, and have twin boys, Luke and Logan. They were born in December 2007.

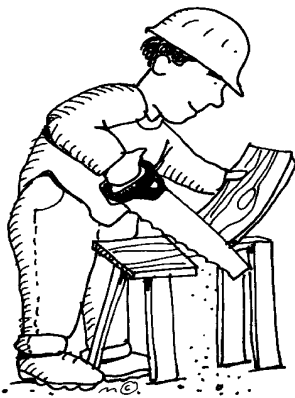
